

Right of Way Program

- Assists counties by reimbursing expenses associated with the collection, management, and disposal/reuse of scrap tires found along county right-of-ways.
- Current ROW agreements reimburse up to \$150,000 over a 3-year period.
- Currently 49 counties enrolled (NEED MORE!)




Facility Registration

- Facilities that wish to apply for grants must be registered unless exempt according to the regulations
- You <u>need</u> to be registered if the following apply:
 - Receive, store, process, or sell recyclable materials that are not used for any on-site end use manufacturing process
 - Recoverable Materials Processing Facilities and Materials Recovery Facilities (MRF's)
- Registration Forms can be found on the ADEM website





Do:


- ✓ Fill out application completely

- ✓ Be in compliance with ADEM recycling regulations


Don't:


